

## PHCA3004: Health Planning and Evaluation Assignment 3: Evaluation Plan (20%)

## **Background**

Primary Health Networks were established in July 2015, with the objectives of increasing the efficiency and effectiveness of medical services for patients, particularly those at risk of poor health outcomes, and to improve coordination of care to ensure patients receive the right care in the right place at the right time. PHNs aim to achieve these objectives on the basis of an understanding of the health care needs of their communities through analysis and planning. In order to achieve these objectives, they must identify the available services and help to address service gaps, while getting value for money.
